




Economic Progress Drives Energy Demand









Energy Mix Continues to Evolve












Gas Supply Grows and Diversifies












North America Unconventional Gas Resource






- Resources for ~100 years coverage at current demand

- Further unconventional gains expected







Unconventional Gas – Paradigm Change
