




Alaska Is Well On Its Way To Its 18th Year of Uninterrupted Growth--the Longest Run In Our History




This Is The Number Of "Spanking" New Jobs In Alaska's Labor Market Per Year



Where The Jobs Are In Alaska




Alaska's Gross State Product




Employment Growth During The Past Decade Has Varied Around The State




Timber Employment Remains A Mere Shadow Of Its Recent Past




Health Care and Construction Have Been The Hot Ones In Alaska









percent employment change from previous year




The Number of Vehicles in Alaska is Certainly Growing Faster than the Population




Alaska's Average Wage Advantage Has Declined Rapidly



Earnings In Alaska Have Changed Little




How Alaska's Average Annual Earnings Stack Up
