To get construction permits, the Port agreed to perform a number of beluga whale monitoring, mitigation and research projects.



PORT OF ANCHORAGE Beluga Whale Protection During Construction


The Port spends \$10 to \$15 million annually on the protection of Beluga Whales

We are required to shut down when Belugas approach our construction area and can't restart until they leave

We are required to shut down two hours before and two hours after low tide

We are required to shut down for two weeks during the smolt releases

We are required to fund scientific studies


