

## **Cruise Passengers = 65% of Alaska Visitors**


2009 Summer Visitors = 1,583,300



Ferry/Highway 63,900 = 4%




Cruise Passengers 1,026,600 = 65%








### Worldwide Cruise Market Continues to Grow


#### 5 new taxes

<b>Total Collected (2007 – 2010)</b>	\$280 m
<ul> <li>State corporate income Tax</li> </ul>	\$ 60 m
<ul><li>33% Gaming fee</li></ul>	\$ 24 m
<ul> <li>\$4 per passenger Ocean Ranger fee</li> </ul>	\$ 16 m
<ul> <li>\$11.50 Regional Impact fee (non-port cities)</li> </ul>	\$ 42 m
<ul> <li>+ \$34.50 per passenger entry fee</li> </ul>	\$138 m

- New regulatory requirements
  - Standards higher than best available technology can achieve
- Full-time State Ocean Rangers on ships
- Contracts with Businesses required to be public

### SeaTrade 2010

- Governor Parnell met with CEOs

    - Improve Regulatory Climate






## **Senate Bill 312 (2010)**

- Tax is reduced from \$46 to \$34.50
  - Additional offset for head taxes paid locally
  - Funds are to be used for facilities and services for passengers and ships
  - Tax rate will be reviewed every three years
  - All ports of call, within the first seven, now receive \$5 per passenger
- Stabilized the regulatory climate/3-year permit
- Increased marketing



# Passenger Volume 2008-2013






# **Bottom Line for the Cruise Alaska Pipeline System**
