### **Governor Parnell Makes Appointments to AEA and AIDEA**

September 27, 2012, Juneau, Alaska – Governor Sean Parnell today announced appointments to the board of directors for the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) and the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA).

Robert Sheldon, of Anchorage, is a third-generation Alaskan and a founder of Arbor Capital Management, Inc. where he currently serves as a principal. Sheldon has extensive business development, financial, and project management experience and has served as a director or partner for privately-held organizations in aviation, banking and finance. He is a commissioner for the Commission on Judicial Conduct and has served on several trade efforts for the State of Alaska. Sheldon is reappointed to a seat representing the private sector.

Gary Wilken, of Fairbanks, is a retired Alaska legislator and small business owner. He represented Fairbanks and Fort Wainwright in the Alaska Senate from 1997 – 2008. Wilken also owned Husky Foods, Fairbanks Distributors, and Great Alaskan Food Co., all wholesale food distribution companies. A Fairbanks resident for 55 years, he has served in numerous community roles, including membership with the Rotary Club of Fairbanks, the Tanana Valley Youth Sports Foundation, the First United Methodist Church, and as an inductee to the Alaska State High School Sports Hall of Fame. Wilken earned a bachelor's degree and a master's in business administration from Oregon State University. He is reappointed to a private-sector seat.

Wilson Hughes, of Anchorage, is a 40-year Alaskan. He has served as chief operating officer of GCI since 1991, and in June, was named the chief executive officer and president of The Alaska Wireless Network, LLC, formed by GCI and Alaska Communications. Hughes has more than 40 years of experience as an executive, engineer and project manager in the communications, engineering, aviation, and construction industries in Alaska. He is past chairman of the Anchorage Economic Development Corporation and former president of Northern Air Cargo, Enserch Alaska Services Inc., and Frank Moolin & Associates, Inc. Hughes earned a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from the University of Missouri at Rolla and a master's degree in science and engineering management from the University of Alaska. A current board member of The Conservation Fund, he is reappointed to a seat representing the private sector.

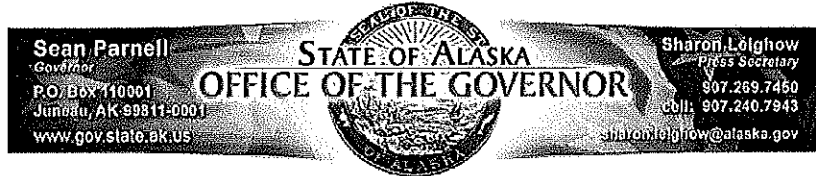

## **State Fights Federal Government Over Costs Imposed on Alaskans Under New Federal Regulation**

October 3, 2012, Juneau, Alaska – The State of Alaska filed in U.S. Federal District Court in Alaska to stop enforcement of the federal government's policy to impose an emission control area (ECA) over a broad swath of ocean off Alaska's coast. The ECA was adopted by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) with no Alaska-specific air testing or monitoring.

"The ECA, if allowed to stay in force, would require marine vessels to use expensive low-sulfur fuels to reduce emissions, increasing the cost of goods and fuel in Alaska," said Governor Parnell. "The EPA's 'one-size-fits-all' approach is unsupported by proper science and modeling in Alaska, and fails to consider and balance impacts on Alaskans. We will ask the court to intervene to try to stop this federal drag on Alaskans and our economy."

The State described impacts for the court such as: increased costs for goods bought each year by Alaskans that pass through the Port of Anchorage; increased costs of transporting Alaska oil to the West Coast that will likely cost the State tens of millions of dollars in revenue; and lost jobs, sales, and revenue from redeployment of cruise ships.
