2003/2004


- BC produced 1.1 TCF of Natural Gas
- BC produced 14.1 Million barrels of Oil
- 1281 wells were drilled in 2003/2004
- Total Direct revenue from Oil and Gas = over \$2.0 Billion

- Royalty Credits:
 - \$30 Million for 03/04 04/05 05/06
 - \$10 Million for 06/07

- Eg. Immediate opportunity for the Sierra Yoyo Desan (SYD) Road in NEBC







Supply – limited short term growth opportunities in N.A





BC's increased drilling is growing production...














...with reserve additions exceeding production...
