
- Icy Strait Point is a majority native owned company operating a cruise ship destination in Hoonah, Alaska.

- Icy Strait Point opened May 23 with the arrival of Celebrity *Summit*.






Location

Description



Icy Strait Point provides the first new cruise destination in Alaska, experienced "One Ship at a Time."

- One mile from the City of Hoonah, the largest Tlingit settlement in Southeast Alaska, and home to the descendants of the natives that originally inhabited Glacier Bay.
- Port activity is centered at the historic 1912 Cannery, once the highest volume cannery on the Pacific Coast.

Port facilities

- Cruise ships currently utilize a lightering dock in Port Frederick Bay currently.
- Anchorages are safe and have been utilized by deep draft logging ships for decades and cruise ships today.

Whales & Marine Mammal Cruise

• Description

Guests cruise along the coast heading north through the waters of Icy Strait and experience the astonishing scenery of Pt. Adolphus. The boat meanders past the magnificent mountainous scenery of the Chilkat mountain range. An on-board naturalist describes the diversity of marine life that migrate to this peaceful place each summer to feed in the abundant waters of Icy Strait.







Saltwater Salmon Charter Fishing



Description

Fishing starts as soon as the boat departs, in comparison to other ports where up to one- hour travel times are required each way. If guests have always wanted to fish in a remote setting, in the midst of spectacular scenery and where the salmon and halibut are abundant, this is the fishing trip of a lifetime., sea otter, sea lions, porpoise and seals to Alaska to feed each summer.





Flightseeing over Glacier Bay



Description

A short plane ride away are the wonders of world-famous Glacier Bay National Park, one of Alaska's geological treasures and sacred homeland to the indigenous Hoonah Tlingit. The tour includes views of the towering glacial fields of the Fairweather and St. Elias mountain ranges and the lush rainforest.



Remote Bush Exploration & Brown Bear Search



Description


Guests are transferred via air conditioned bus for a trip through the tiny town of Hoonah to the remote bush area of the Spasski River Valley in search of brown bears, deer, other animals, plants and points of interest.







Food and Beverage



• Description

Situated at water's edge at Cannery Point, guests rendezvous for a salmon feast on the coastal shoreline of a wilderness beach. The pristine waters of Icy Strait and the Chilkat mountain range provide the perfect panoramic scenery for this secluded location. Guests relaxing by the fire should keep an eye out for eagles soaring overhead or whales swimming in the front of the salmon bake.







Cannery Historical Tour & Museum



Description

Guests step back in time to 1936 as they begin their first day on the job at the Hoonah Packing Company Cannery. Guests are outfitted in standard fish cutter aprons. This lighthearted guided walking tour of this historic cannery begins when "employees" clock in and proceed to orientation where they learn about every step in the process of the canning line.







Tlingit "Journey through Time" Trail



Description

This venue is a guided interpretive walking tour, led by a Native Huna Tlingit on a "Journey Through Time". Guests learn the story about a people's survival and success in an environment that is harsh and wild, yet bountiful and beautiful. The trail runs along the edge of a lake where guests view multiple displays that illustrate the many ways the Huna Tlingit learned to live and thrive in this magnificent land.







Native Heritage Center Theatre & Tlingit Dancers

Description

The local Huna Tlingit Dancers perform in their colorful full regalia as they reveal their history through interpretive song, dance and story telling. The performances embrace the ancient significance of the Raven and Eagle and how these birds have given them identity.








Non-Tour Activities
