Alaska's Natural Resources - North to the Future



Oil & Gas: With the discovery of Prudhoe Bay and the construction of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline, the oil and gas industry has become Alaska's economic lifeline and a major secure source of domestic energy. North Slope oil fields accounted for an average of 20 percent of the nation's domestic production between 1980 and 2000. Currently, Alaska accounts for 13.4% of U.S. production. Alaska's oil and gas industry has produced more than 16 billion barrels of oil. Since 1957, the State of Alaska has collected approximately \$90 billion from the oil and gas industry.



Mining: Historically, mining has been a cornerstone of Alaska's economy. Many roads, docks and other infrastructure throughout Alaska were originally constructed to serve the mining industry. Major communities like Fairbanks, Juneau and Nome were founded on mining activity. Today, a rejuvenated mining industry brings a broad range of benefits to Alaska, offering some of the highest paying jobs in both urban and rural Alaska, as well as generating significant local and state government tax payments and royalties to Native corporations for activity on their land.



Fishing: Alaska is the only state to have coastlines on three different seas: the Arctic Ocean, Pacific Ocean and Bering Sea. Fifty percent of the nation's commercially harvested fish come from Alaska, nearly four times more than the next largest state. Eight of Alaska's ports consistently rate in the top 30 U.S. ports in terms of volume and value of seafood delivered. Dutch Harbor-Unalaska and Kodiak have consistently ranked as the top ports in the nation in terms of seafood value and pounds harvested. Seafood has been, and remains, Alaska's top export commodity.



Forestry: The forest industry has been an important contributor to the Alaska economy for over a half century. Sitka spruce and hemlock of very high quality have been exported as logs, lumber and timbers into the Pacific Rim for the past four decades. Alaska has 129 million acres of forested land, stretching from the coastal rain forest of Southeast and Southcentral Alaska to the boreal forest of the Interior. Four landlords manage Alaska's forests: the federal government, 51%; state and local government, including the University of Alaska system, 25%; Native corporations, 24% and private landowners, 0.4%.



Tourism: Alaska is like no other place. It has more mountains, glaciers and wildlife than just about anywhere else in the world. Alaska has become a top visitor destination and the industry has experienced steady growth, but visitor numbers were down in 2009. The most noticeable trends in the visitor industry are attributable to the the cruise ship industry, which brings more than half of all visitors to Alaska. In recent years, visitor volume has exceeded 1.7 million visitors in the May-September season.
